

Dave Wightman, M. Gen (Ret)

Prior to retiring to Victoria, Dave had a long and distinguished career with the RCAF, including tours with the Maritime Air Command, attendance at the USAF Experimental Test Pilot School, Senior Test Pilot for the RCAF, and command of all Canadian Armed Forces Units in Europe. Dave then went on to become the Assistant Deputy Minister of Transport Canada, where he was responsible for the regulation of Canadian civil aircraft and the operation of the Canadian air traffic control system.



Dave will talk about two of his more unique experiences; flying a Sopwith Snipe as part of the Canadian Centennial in 1967, and the initiation of the project to privatize air navigation service in Canada.
