

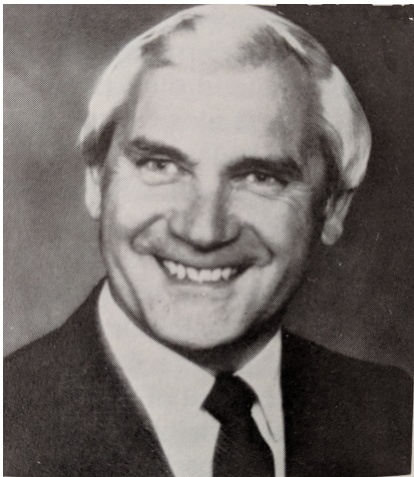

## *The Mighty Vulcan*

The **Avro Vulcan** was a tail-less, jet powered delta winged aircraft that first flew in 1952 and entered service with RAF in 1956. Of the three V-bombers produced in this area, the Vulcan was considered the most technologically advanced and therefore the most risky design. It was the backbone of the UK's nuclear deterrent strike force until its retirement in 1984 and took part in many important operations, including the Black Buck mission in the 1982 Falklands War. Harvey flew the Vulcan from 1966 – 1969 with #44 (Rhodesian) Squadron, including hair-raising tests of the new Terrain-Following-Radar in 1968. Harvey will relate anecdotes and personal impressions of flying this iconic aircraft.



**Harvey Moore** was born and raised in Glasgow, Scotland. He received both his Glider and Private Pilot License from Air Cadets and joined the RAF in 1957. Receiving his wings in 1959, Harvey flew many of the classic Cold War Jets, including the Valiant, Vampire and Canberra before retiring and moving to Vancouver in 1969. Now living on Salt Spring Island, Harvey continues to be interested in aviation affairs.
