### *Canadian Dam Busters*

The Dam Busters World War II raid on the German dams is legendary. Canadians played a huge part in it and paid a high price; of the 30 who participated,

14 were killed and one was a Prisoner of War. Ted will present the story of this raid, and focus on the Canadians who



faced the dangers with courage and determination.

Ted Barris is an accomplished writer, journalist, professor, and broadcaster who has authored 18 non-fiction books. Many of his subjects concern Canadians and the sacrifices made for their country during periods of conflict. These include; *Victory at Vimy*, *Juno*, *The Great Escape*, *Behind the Glory*, and *Deadlock in Korea*.
